Guest Speakers:

Lisa Safaeinili, Executive Director, Westminster Free Clinic

- Ms. Safaeinili presented a three-minute video highlighting the Westminster Free Clinic. Additionally, she shared moving stories about some of the 94 CVUSD students who are involved in the program.
- The clinic offers parenting programs, grief counseling, legal services as well as medical and dietary assistance.
- Ms. Safaeinili distributed newsletters highlighting recent programs and events.

Jennifer Caldwell, Events Manager, FOOD SHARE, Ventura County's Food Bank

- Ms. Caldwell offered a brief overview of the program. They currently occupy two warehouses in Oxnard, one for storage and one for food distribution. The food bank is currently heavily involved with aiding those impacted by the Thomas fire.
- Some of the statistics she shared: 86,000 people in Ventura County are food insecure, less than 1% of the distributed food goes to the homeless, and 49% of those who visit the pantry come once a year.
- A new senior program provides seniors with a 30-pound box of food once a month.
