

WHAT TO BRING TO YOUR AP EXAM

- A valid school or government issued **photo id** is **required** at every exam you take.
- **Two sharpened No. 2 pencils** (with erasers) for completing multiple-choice answer sheets
- **Two pens with black or dark blue ink** only for completing areas on the exam booklet covers and for free-response questions in most exams
- Six-digit **school code**. Homeschooled students will be provided with their state or country homeschool code at the time of the exam.
- **A watch** that does not have internet access, an alarm, and doesn't beep.
- **Up to two approved calculators** with the necessary capabilities only if taking an AP Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, Physics, or Statistics Exam. Visit AP College Board for the policy and a list of approved calculators.
- **A ruler or straightedge** only if taking the AP Physics Exam, protractors are *not* allowed.
- Small **snack and drink** in a clear plastic bag with your name and placed in designated break area

WHAT STUDENTS CANNOT BRING TO THE AP EXAM ROOM

- **Electronic equipment** is prohibited in the exam room and break area. This includes phones, smartwatches, or wearable technology of any kind, laptops, tablet computers, Bluetooth devices, portable listening or recording devices—MP3 player, iPod®, etc.—cameras or photographic equipment, devices that can access the internet, separate timers of any type, and any other electronic or communication devices.
- **Aids** such as books, compasses, correction fluid, dictionaries, notes, mechanical or colored pencils, scratch paper, ear plugs, or clipboards.
- **Computers**
- Reference **guides**, keyboard **maps**, or other typing **instructions**
- Unapproved calculators
- **Watches** that beep or have an alarm or can access the internet
- **Clothing** or shoes with subject-related information
- **Backpacks** or purses will be stored and access denied until you are dismissed after the exam.

*Some questions cannot be answered without a graphing calculator and no other type is permitted (even as a back-up).

Calculators are *not* allowed for any other AP Exams including Macroeconomics, Microeconomics, and Environmental Science.
