



CVUSD Outdoor School- Camp Ramah Health and Safety Guidelines



CVUSD and Camp Ramah have worked together in partnership to develop the following COVID-19 safety guidelines for the CVUSD 6th grade Outdoor Program. Camp Ramah successfully hosted CVUSD's Outdoor Program during the spring of 2023. CVUSD and Camp Ramah agree to follow K-12 California Department of Public Health ([CDPH](#)) [CDPH 23-24 Guidance](#) that outlines safety measures that will be in place to support the overall safety and participation of CVUSD students and staff in the Outdoor Program. **We recognize that these state guidelines are subject to change, and necessary adjustments will occur to the safety guidelines listed below.**

1. Masks -

- a. Masks are optional.
- b. CVUSD will provide additional masks if a student loses or does not have a mask.
- c. Standard disposable face masks and N95 masks will be available for student and staff use and will be provided upon request.

2. Ventilation -

- a. Camp Ramah has updated all filters to the MERV 13 and has installed them in every building and bunk room.
- b. The windows to bunk rooms should remain open pending weather conditions.

3. Protocols for Handling a Sick Person -

- a. Camp Ramah has a Health Center where CVUSD contracted nurses are stationed 24 hours/day.
- b. If a student exhibits any symptoms, they will visit the Health Center where they will be evaluated and temporarily isolated if necessary. Isolation will occur away from other students who may also need to come to the Health Center.
- c. Parents/guardians will be contacted to pick up the symptomatic student from Camp Ramah with the recommendation that the student is tested for COVID-19.
- d. If the student tests positive, they will be asked to isolate in accordance with updated CDPH [Guidance on Isolation and Quarantine for COVID-19 \(ca.gov\)](#)

4. Hand Hygiene -

- a. Camp Ramah staff, naturalists, and counselors will promote hand washing throughout the day, especially before and after eating, after using the toilet, and after handling garbage.
- b. Camp Ramah will ensure adequate supplies are on hand to support healthy hygiene behaviors, including soap, tissues, no touch trash cans, face coverings, and hand sanitizers with at least 60 percent Ethyl alcohol for staff and students.

5. Cleaning -

- a. High-touch surfaces in restrooms and bunk rooms will be cleaned once a day.
- b. Cleaning and disinfection of the cabin, Health Center, or any other space occupied by a person testing positive for COVID-19 within the last 24 hours will be conducted.
