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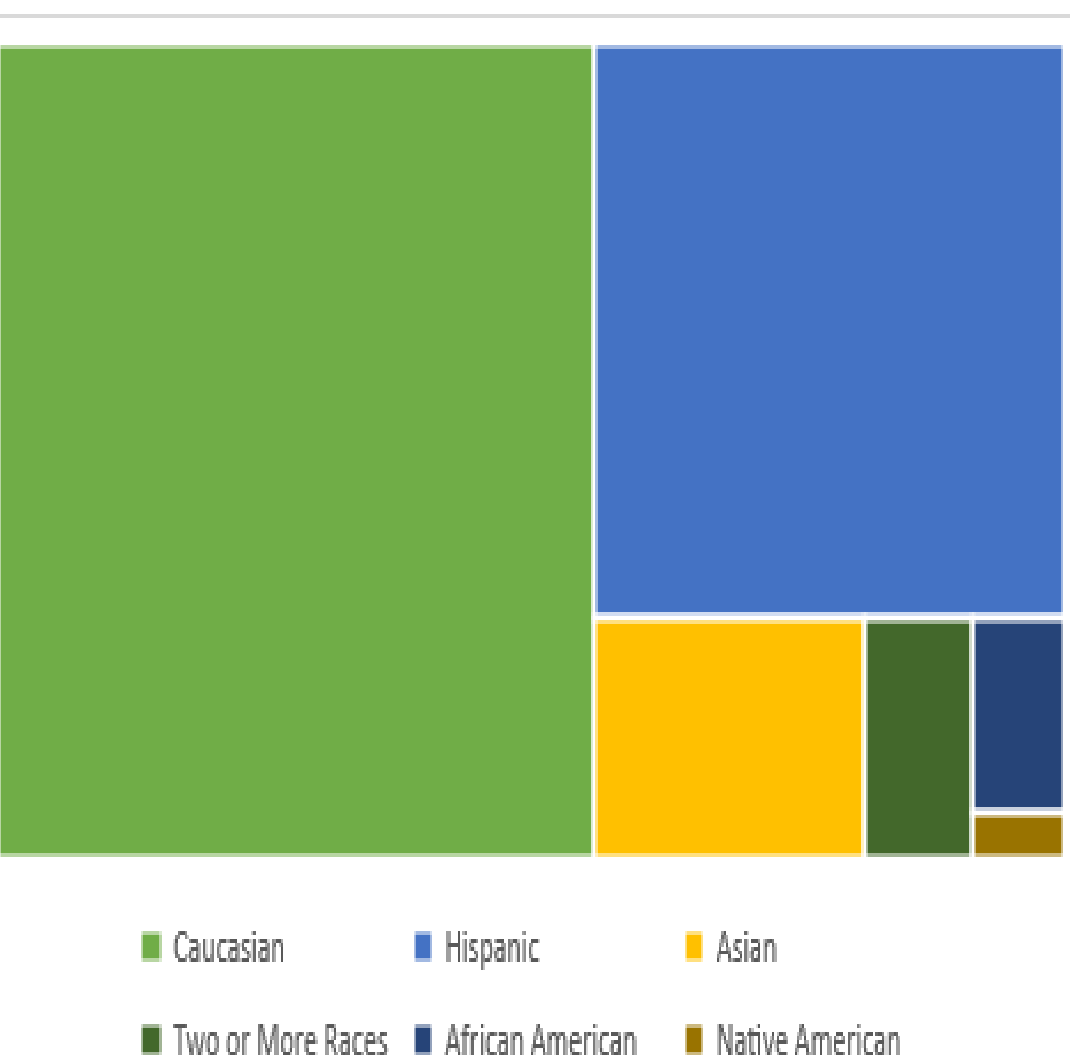

Thousand Oaks High School is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) through the 2023 school year and was named a California Gold Ribbon School in 2016-17 for developing innovative programs that support rigorous academic standards and a positive school environment. The nearly 2100 students in grades 9-12 enjoy a sprawling campus that sits at the border of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties. In 2014 Thousand Oaks was ranked the FBI's fourth safest large city in America. The abundant biotech and aerospace industries nearby influence the high standard of education and expectation in the Conejo Valley Unified School District.

Student success is supported by tutoring centers on campus, over 100 student-run extracurricular clubs, as well as an award-winning dance team, band, orchestra and choir. Our Associated Student Body (ASB) and Green Hole student cheering section create a unified "Bleed Green" community that Thousand Oaks High School is known for.

## SPECIAL ON-CAMPUS ACADEMIC OPPORTUNITIES

The Center for Advanced Studies and Research (The Center)

Students in The Center represent the most academically rigorous college candidates on campus. Students must apply as freshmen for the program and commit to a three-year course of study with a minimum unweighted grade point average of 3.6 at the end of each semester to remain in the program. Students must take a minimum of 7 Advanced Placement courses, including the AP Capstone as well as complete a Senior Culminating Experience (SCE) that ties their three years in the program together. The SCE can focus on one of three areas: Giving back to the community, Proposing a solution to a problem they've researched, or Furthering their research with the intent to publish or submit for national competition. All students learn literature review and meta-analysis and adhere to the International Science and Engineering Fair (ISEF) standards. Each research paper and project is submitted to Institutional Review Board (IRB) or Scientific Review Committee (SRC) before moving forward. Students produce original research equivalent to an upper-division college level course which more than prepares them for the rigors of academia beyond high school. The class of 2018 graduated with an average GPA of 4.47 and took an average of 11 Advanced Placement exams. Graduates have a 100% 4-year college acceptance rate to some of the most prestigious universities in the nation.

## ETHOS Entrepreneurship Academy

As one of only four entrepreneurship California Partnership Academies, ETHOS targets the learners whose creativity and gifts aren't necessarily fostered in the traditional classroom. ETHOS is a school-within-a-school offering UC a-g approved courses including core English, history and math classes with a focus on business and entrepreneurship. In this three-year program, students take electives in Entrepreneurship, Sports and Entertainment Marketing, and Virtual Enterprise that utilize project-based learning and business models to drive curriculum. Students experience real-world marketing and networking with local and regional business owners and learn how to create and run a business. Senior year, they take their business plan, mock-ups, sales team, and management staff to the California Virtual Enterprise Trade Show competition. ETHOS students have created and marketed products such as survival bracelets for the outdoorsman, a phone case with amplified speaker components, a rescue UAV and the like, all before leaving high school.

## The Majors at Thousand Oaks High School

The extracurricular Majors Program provides students with experiences to understand, narrow or expand career choices beyond high school. Students apply in the fall to one of 17 majors and can change their major each year. While in the program, students complete a 30-hour internship, attend monthly meetings with guest speakers in their field of interest, participate in field trips, job shadows and an annual conference while learning to be proactive about planning their future. Students who successfully complete all of the Majors requirements, including an annual project, receive recognition at graduation and a certificate of completion.

In addition to offering 25 Advanced Placement courses, Thousand Oaks High School was one of the first schools in the nation, and one of only 11 in California, to offer the AP Capstone. We also offer dual-enrollment Statistics, Introduction to Business, and Public Speaking taught by university professors through Moorpark Community College. We are the only school in CVUSD to offer 5 world languages, 4 at the AP level.

### CALIFORNIA BILITERACY SEAL

Thousand Oaks High School students were the first in the Conejo Valley Unified School District to earn the California State Seal of Biliteracy awarded by the legislature and certifying attainment of a high level of proficiency in two or more languages. Students must take four-years of a world language or three years plus score a 3 or higher on an Advanced Placement exam while maintaining a 3.0 gpa or higher. In 2018, 112 graduates were awarded the gold seal on their diploma.

### PEER MENTORING

The goal of the program is to create a more inclusive environment where students feel they belong to something greater than themselves. Students participate in team-building activities, self-reflection and self-confidence/communication exercises in order to improve their self-esteem and provide targeted activities for the student body. Peer Mentors also facilitate Lunch Bunch which provides daily positive social and emotional support through organized activities, friendship building, and group discussion to improve campus culture.

### LANCER BAND

As a competing member of Bands of America and the Southern California School Band and Orchestra Assoc., the Lancer band, which consists of two concert bands, two jazz bands, percussion ensemble, drum line, color guard, winter guard and the Lancer marching band continue to receive superior ratings in local and regional competitions. Students are also represented in Honor Bands at the County, State and National levels. For the past 8 years, a Lancer has been nominated for and ultimately selected to the Army All-American Band.

### THE LANCER NEWSPAPER

Published 10 times annually, The Lancer is a nationally-acclaimed publication awarded the Gold Crown in 2016 and 2017 by the Columbia Scholastic Press Association and was inducted into the National Scholastic Press Association Hall of Fame in 2010 by earning their highest ranking for 10 consecutive years. Students must interview for their staff positions on the paper and are responsible for content, editing and design. They also raise 100% of funds to cover production costs.
