- OTRM \$31,266 Target Remedial Fund to support EL, SPED, SED, Foster/homeless.
- ESR3 \$62,744 - Learning Loss resources and intervention. Last time we will receive these funds.
- Title II \$900-for professional development.
- All chairs are giving me what they need regarding goals. Decided not to change any goals.
- Reviewed each of the five proposed goals for 2023-2024 school year and the went over the metrics used to measure their progress.
- Is there anything we need to consider as a staff to change for next year?
- Announcements cannot be heard outside.
- Olivia - maybe send out a survey to all students to see what they would like or how they are feeling.
- Thomas - teachers should try and be aware of context with students and not assume a student is doing something wrong.
- Kaylin - teachers need to be more strict with phones. Kids are tricky placing phone computers to hide phones.
- Sydney - with taking tests, phones can be placed in the container. Maybe require computers to be shut when testing.
- Michelle - what about phones placed down on corner of desk
- Butcher - how about having a shoe organizer and phones get put in there.
- Will send out a google survey to everyone to get feedback from parents.
