Big Brothers Big Sisters of America



- “Bigs” spend time weekly with their “Little”, one on one, for a period of at least a year. By making that weekly visit, volunteers instill the message that someone cares, and that each Little can and should care about themselves and their future.
- Before volunteers can be matched they must be interviewed individually by a staff member, pass an online background check, and provide us with 3 references. Any type of conviction on the volunteer’s record would need to be disclosed and discussed. Also the volunteer must attend a 3-hour free training held at our office.
- The “Littles” who can enroll are **boys ages 8 – 15 and girls, ages 6 – 15**. Matched children can remain in the program until they are 21. A staff member provides support on a monthly basis to the Big, the Little, and the child’s guardian.

BIG BROTHERS BIG SISTERS - THE IMPACT

A study for Big Brothers Big Sisters found that kids matched with a Big Brother or Big Sister:

- are more confident
- are more likely to steer clear of drugs and alcohol
- do better in school
- get along better with their family and friends
- feel better about themselves

Juneteenth is the oldest known celebration commemorating the ending of slavery in the United States.

On June 19, 1865, two and a half years after President Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation, Union soldiers led by Major General Gordon Granger rode into Galveston, Texas with news that the war had ended and the slaves in Texas were now free.

President Joe Biden signed a bill establishing Juneteenth National Independence Day, the date marking the end of slavery in the United States, as a federal holiday.

Summer School Opportunities



Conejo Valley Unified School District is proud to support its students' diverse academic needs and ambitions. The following are popular accredited summer school options, although the list is not exhaustive. Coursework completed at other accredited institutions will be eligible for placement on the high school transcript.

Students may choose to enroll in a summer school program for acceleration and/or credit recovery purposes.

Students cannot enroll in two public high school programs concurrently for the purpose of credit recovery.

Students may enroll in any accredited summer school program and earn up to 20 credits towards graduation.

Examples of available programs are listed below.



CVUSD Credit Recovery Summer School

Students may enroll in CVUSD's free credit recovery summer school, if they qualify, with guidance from their assigned high school counselors. Any student who earns a D or F in a graduation-required course should enroll in the CVUSD Credit Recovery Summer School program. This program is for students that need to repeat one or two semesters of a course in order to raise their grade.

APEX Learning*

APEX is an online high school and a fully accredited, private, high school academy that offers full- and part-time options to students who need a high quality, alternative education.

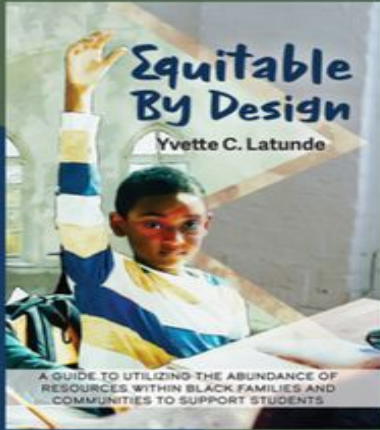
