

**COURSE TITLE:** Stagecraft

**Course Description:**

This class is designed to be the second course in the Arts, Media, and Entertainment pathway. Students will continue to study theatrical lighting, audio production, set construction, stage management, property management, theatrical stage rigging, and costume design in a more advanced way. Students will be placed on various technical crews, working with other students collaboratively on theatrical productions, and creating a community where ideas can be shared positively, in a real world theatrical environment. Students will be doing a combination of theatrical production work, internships with professional and community theatre companies, and in class production projects. Stagecraft students are expected to design and create elements for the theatrical productions, in addition to providing technical support and design, as necessary, for other events on campus, such as Dance Concerts, Choir events, Band Festivals, Talent Shows, etc. Students will also be expected to serve in a leadership capacity and mentor students in the Technical Theatre class.
