Course Description:

This course has a primary focus on digital camera use and computer post-production work. In Digital Photography One students focus on learning the tools of the camera to develop technically sound images. Students learn the technical functions of shutter speed, aperture, ISO as well as other tool functions. Students also develop skills in photo composition and image editing techniques using Adobe Photoshop. In Digital Photography Two, students learn many more advanced image editing techniques using Photoshop such as photomontage, colorization, artistic filtering and color correction. Also emphasized are the Elements and Principles of Photography and Color Theory. Students do research projects on historic photos and iconic photographers. There is also a reading/writing requirement that includes textbook chapter questions, and the development of skills in writing critiques of photographic images. Students also produce a professionally mounted portfolio at the end of the course. There is not a pre-requisite class required for this course.
