Purpose & Plan Updates

Provide information on ELO-P requirements, stakeholder engagement, and current TK-6th grade programs

First approved in May 2022

- ELO-P plan must be board approved every 3 years

Updated plan reflects changes between May 2022 and June 2025



Expanded Learning Opportunities Program (ELO-P)

What is it?

 ELO-P is a state funded law that provides funding for enrichment programs for students in TK-6th grade.





When is it offered?

In the CVUSD, our ELO-P offers after school, summer, and/or intersession learning opportunities that focus on developing the academic, social, emotional, and physical needs and interests of our students through hands-on and engaging learning experiences. [EC Section 8482.1(a)]

ELO-P Specifications

Hours of Program

- At least 9 hours of programming each day, including the school day

Days of Program

- 210 days total (180 school days + 30 non-school days)

Location of Program

- Provided on school sites within the District
- Provided on community partners' sites









ELO-P Funding Guidelines

Unduplicated funding formula: ~ \$1,580.00 per pupil

Must offer to all unduplicated students (EL, NSLP, Foster, and McKinney-Vento) in TK-6th grade

- In 2024, we began offering ELO-P to our 7th and 8th grade McKinney-Vento students

Required to serve at least 50% of unduplicated students

- Homework help and/or tutoring from CVUSD credentialed teachers at all sites for


1-2 hours/day, Monday-Thursday.
