TREASURER'S REPORT – Colette Noblitt

September 2022 PL Summary

Beginning Balance September 1, 2022: \$37,032.56

Income:

- We received \$5,614.79 via Cash/Check/SQ/Venmo for PFA Membership / Support our School / Direct Donation (this includes Venmo transactions for August – transferred into Bank of the West account on 9/1; September Venmo to be reported in October)
- 2. Corporate Matching from SCE and Amgen brought in \$550 for the month
- 3. Our first Restaurant Night of the year (Tifa and Ameci) generated \$312.49 for Aspen PFA

- 4. We received \$166 from the End of Summer Ice Cream Social via Venmo; total income for the Ice Cream Social was \$797!
- 5. The annual Photo Fundraiser has already brought in \$726.75
- 6. Family Movie Night generated \$580.53 for PFA; \$124 of this came from D'Amores Pizza
- The Student Store generated \$2,150 in sales of the t-shirts and planners (this includes Venmo transactions for August – transferred into Bank of the West account on 9/1; September Venmo to be reported in October)

Total Income in September = \$10,100.56 (\$5,614.79+\$550+\$312.49+\$166+\$726.75+\$580.53+\$2,150) **Expenses:**

- 1. We paid \$1,487.50 combined for the Gypsy Services (Hispanic Heritage) Assembly and BMX assembly deposit (remainder of BMX assembly paid in Oct.)
- 2. We paid \$755.59 for Family Movie Night (FunFlicks)
- 3. We paid \$78.28 in Misc. Expenses (purchased a photo backdrop holder for PFA)
- 4. We paid \$958.44 for new Aspen Spirit-wear t-shirts (second order)
- 5. We paid \$129.33 for End of Summer Social

Total Expenses in September = \$3,409.14 (\$1,487.50+\$755.59+\$78.28+\$958.44+\$129.33)

Net Gain = \$6,691.42

Ending Balance September 30, 2022 = \$43,723.98 (\$37,032.56 + \$6,691.42)
