# PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE – Dr. Craven

- Thank you for Harvest Fest the kids are still talking about Spooky House. Teachers didn't want to get in dunk tank, so they were happy.
- Red Ribbon Week was great the kids liked finding the ribbons, there were lots of fun things to do that week. Traci came to help as well!
- The first week of December is Inclusive Schools Week we'll be celebrating and working with counselor to create inclusive murals. Doing something similar at Maple as well doing a lot of reading and activity around it.
- The new camera and buzzer are on the main door to the office don't have to get up to answer but also give controlled single point of entry. Controlled gates into school and office added safety precaution. Going to add that to the Child Care gate, as well.
- All staff classified participated in training on 11/28 active shooter training with another school. Important to hear directly from law enforcement on how to work together and important to train staff and know more than just the basic drills. Training serves as an added safety measure, so we are on the same page and using the right protocols.
- 3rd grade parent GATE screening on 12/13 and 12/14 unless you opted out. Held in classroom and not lab. Stefanie Caswell will be coming to facilitate.
- 5th grade parents future Viking night at Redwood tomorrow night (11/16). Principal Judd is putting on informational past Aspen parent coming to talk to parents at Aspen as well.
- HOT OFF THE PRESS! Shift in school calendar 12/16 is a minimum day all elementary schools out at 12:30. Rarely does it happen but adjustments were made. It's just an hour earlier for us since it's a Friday.

# TREASURER'S REPORT – Colette Noblitt

Beginning Balance October 1, 2022: \$43,723.98

# Income:

- We received \$2,580.49 via Check/SQ/Venmo for PFA Membership / Support our School / Direct Donation (this includes Venmo transactions for September – transferred into Bank of the West account on 10/1; October Venmo to be reported in November)
- 2. Corporate Matching from Benevity brought in \$252.46 for the month
- 3. Ralphs / Kroger Rewards contributed \$300 in October
- 4. Restaurant Night at Cisco's generated \$300 for Aspen PFA
- 5. The annual Photo Fundraiser brought in \$1,206.19 in October for a total of \$1,932.94

- 6. Harvest Fest was wildly successful this year \$3,825 was received in cash/checks (Venmo amount of \$641 to be reported in November); additionally, the Bake Sale sold \$557.50 during Harvest Fest!
- The Student Store generated \$602.01 in sales of the t-shirts and planners (this includes Venmo transactions for Sept – transferred into Bank of the West account on 10/1; October Venmo to be reported in November)

Total Income in October = \$9,624.82 (\$2,580.49+\$252.46+\$301.17+\$300+\$1,206.19+\$4,382.50+\$602.01)

#### **Expenses:**

- 1. We paid \$446.29 for the remainder of the BMX assembly
- 2. We paid \$24.50 in Bank Fees (excess cash and check deposits; upon discussion with the bank manager, this has since been reversed/credited by the bank, and they have changed our account type, so we do not incur these types of fees going forward)

Total Expenses in October = \$470.79 (\$446.29+\$24.50)

Ending Balance October 31, 2022 = \$52,878.01 (\$43,723.98 + \$9,154.03)
