#### DAC Report:

Presentation by Assistant Superintendent Lou Lichtl -

Elementary level enrollment: Blended right now is 4394, Remote is at 2456 (34%), Shine is at 384 (these numbers change almost daily).

Clarification and explanation on the covid dashboard (i.e. parents self-report the cases, the numbers are not cumulative, they only show active cases, it is updated daily)

Clarification that classrooms do not go remote because of a positive case.

The district is working hard to open high schools on 1/19.

The LCAP (Local Control Accountability Plan) survey will be sent out in January.

Resources in the budget are being focused toward homeless and foster youth.

There has been success in a pilot program at TOHS where there are combo classes of some kids remote and some in-person.

## ELAC Report:



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A new equity task force has been created consisting of 5 HS students, 5 parents and 5 staff purpose is to help address racism and provide a place where students and parents can anonymously report discrimination. A Diversity and Equity Inclusion website is being created. There was also a presentation on learning loss.

## SEDAC Report:

SEDAC Curriculum Committee reported that the district is working with them to provide books that can help special needs students understand vocabulary of the new sex education curriculum and that parents can also read with the students

The Student District Advisory Committee (SDAC) will now join the monthly SEDAC meetings and have been added as a committee report agenda item. Two Westlake High School students joined the SEDAC meeting as SDAC representatives.

SDAC is also planning to meet with teachers about mental health and give them resources The Student Health Curriculum Forum is being formed within SDAC that will include all students. They will meet to discuss the top 5 needs for the curriculum.

The 5 Inclusion Heroes will be announced at the School Board meeting tonight (12/15). There were over 150 nominations.

The SEDAC Information/Training Committee presented their plan.

Mr. Lou Lichtl, Assistant Superintendent, Instructional Services presented on the purpose and timeline of SPSA as well as the seven recommended Steps for Development of SPSA:
