


#### Requirements:

• High School diploma or 18 years or older

#### Offers:

- Transfer options to CSU, UC, & Private
- Vocational Training
- Concurrent enrollment for HS students

CSU



#### Requirements:

- A-G requirements
- 2.5 A-G GPA or higher

#### Offers:

- Bachelor's Degrees
- Master's Degrees
- Doctorate Degrees

UC



#### Requirements:

- A-G requirements
- 3.0 A-G GPA or higher

#### Offers:

- Bachelor's Degrees
- Master's Degrees
- Doctorate Degrees

Other Public & Private Colleges



#### Requirements:

- Each has own requirements (many similar to A-G)
- May require SAT/ACT


#### Offers:

- Bachelor's Degrees

## WHAT IS A-G?

It is the minimum 15 courses that must be completed with a C or higher to be eligible to apply to a UC (University of California) or CSU (California State University)

A-G = COLLEGE READY





# HOW TO MEET THE ENGLISH REQUIREMENT FOR STUDENTS WHO STILL REQUIRE AN ELD COURSE



UC-approved high school courses


Four years of college-preparatory English that include frequent writing, from brainstorming to final paper, as well as reading of classic and modern literature. No more than one year of ESL-type courses can be used to meet this requirement.



## DUAL ENROLLMENT

- Alternative way to be "college-ready".
- Dual enrollment is when students are enrolled in high school and college at the same time.
- Students can earn credits for both high school and college.
- Relatively low cost- tuition is free!
  - Must pay a fee- approximately \$40
  - May have to pay for textbook- though many classes have no fee for textbooks!








# HOW TO SUPPORT YOUR STUDENT

- Encourage your student to do their best
- Stay connected throughout all their school stages (Q, Canvas, Newsletters, Parent Nights, Social Media, Email)
- Emphasize the important of reading
- Connect to support early
- Check grades on Q/Canvas regularly
- If changing a class in high school, ask counselor about impact on A-G status and future plans
- Encourage your student to attend tutoring centers
- Look for A–G class indicators when filling out registration forms
- Utilize californiacolleges.edu parent account





The CSU Eligibility Tool helps you track your progress toward meeting eligibility for CSU by listing required coursework on the far left and comparing it to your completed and enrolled coursework. To ensure you stay on track, use this tool to also plan for future courses that are offered at your school and help satisfy CSU requirements

All of your coursework on the Eligibility Tool will be color-coded with each color representing something different sibe sure to study the legend below carefully.

The University of California (UC) Course Management Portal (CMP) is a website where all your "a-g" courses are tracked by both the CSU and UC. Your school district enters courses into UC CMP. If you see a course in yellow or your CSU and UC Eligibility Tools, this means your school has labeled the course as "a-g", but it is not listed in UC CMP. Talk with your counselor to learn more when you see courses in yellow.





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
