High School: CVUSD Credit Recovery & Acceleration

Credit Recovery

Hosted at Thousand Oaks High School

July 1 - July 29

Enrollment: 785 students (unduplicated)

- Term 1 Enrollment: 631 students
- Term 2 Enrollment: 657 students

Student Participation and Pass Rates

- HS Credit Recovery - 785 students with a D or F from 2021-22 (95%)

Over 25 unaffiliated programs and/or institutions (WASC accredited and UC approved) utilized by our CVUSD students over the summer.

Enrollment: 147 students

- Accelerated PE via APEX - 31 students with an IEP (100%)
- Accelerated PE, Health or World History - 67 English Learners (100%)

- July 5th-29th, 8:30 AM -11:50 AM

Students Served:

- Students who received D's or F's at Semester 1 or Quarter 3
- English Learners
- Students seeking to accelerate in math pathway

Participation, Courses & Metrics::

- Total 315 students
- Courses offered:
 - ELD, ELA and Math Intervention
 - Enrichment (i.e. Drama, 3D art, STEM, & World Cultures and Geography)
 - 97.7% of marks received were Pass
- Virtual Math Boost Camp - 109 students participated

- 31 English Learners, Foster Youth and Low Income students participated from 11:50 AM to 5:30 PM at Redwood Middle School Boys & Girls Club Notter Facility.

After Summer Learning Camp, 12:00 PM - 5:30 PM

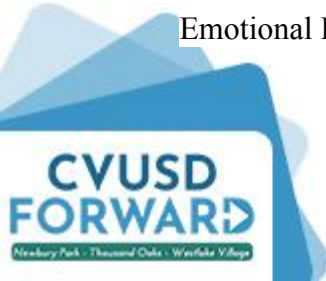
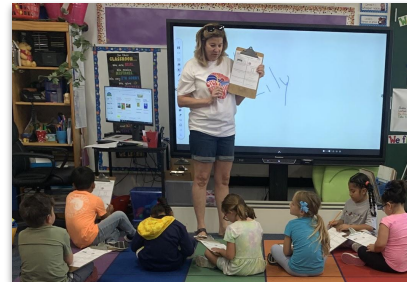
- Coordinated by Star Education at both school sites.

June 27 - July 29

Students offered enrollment by Title I School Staff based on Social Emotional, Academic, and Executive Functioning needs.

Extended School Year (ESY)

ESY services are special education and related services that are provided to students as determined in their individualized education plans (IEPs). Services are intended to help maintain skills and routines that students have learned during the regular school year.

- **Elementary and Secondary Level Summer Programs**
 - Emerging, Expanding and Bridging English Learners participated in different summer school programs focused on learning loss and acceleration
- **Instructional Focus**
 - Ensured English Learners continue to receive instruction during the summer to prevent learning loss and increase their literacy skills
 - Provided opportunity to English Learners to accelerate their learning for high school credit through different course offerings
- **Number of Students**
 - Elementary: 320 English Learners
 - Middle School: 100 English Learners
 - High School Acceleration Focus: 67 English Learners for Accelerated Learning
 - High School Language Development Focus: 40 Newcomers for English Language Development
- **Courses Offered**
 - English Language Development
 - English Language Arts and Math Intervention
 - Health (Accelerated Class)
 - Physical Education (Accelerated Class)
 - World History (Accelerated Class)
 - Science, Technology, Engineering, Math (STEM)



Early Back Intervention

- August 15-19
- Students in grades K-5 were explicitly invited based on unique needs, first via email, then by personal phone call, to participate in the five-day program
- Three classes each at Acacia, Conejo, and Walnut
 - Nine CVUSD credentialed teachers
 - Six bilingual paraeducators
 - Three special education paraeducators
 - Transportation provided to those in need
- Welcomed students back, revisited essential skills in ELA and math, built executive functioning and social-emotional learning skills while keeping it fun!
- All 65 students left with backpacks filled with school supplies and a new pair of shoes to start the school year, thanks to community partner donations
